Stafford begins *Wisdom Walking* with the idea that life is a pilgrimage and uses this to guide readers on their own pilgrimage toward wisdom. He layers onto that idea the notion that on our pilgrimages of life we can be gaining wisdom about our lives. Stafford then adds the Jungian typology for gaining wisdom and tells all of this through stories of his own and others’ pilgrimages in a very readable fashion.

Life is a pilgrimage; make yours one that leads to greater wisdom!

GIL STAFFORD, PhD, DMin, is Canon Theologian for the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona and Assisting Priest at St. Peter’s Episcopal Church, Litchfield Park, Arizona. Prior to being ordained a priest, he was the President of Grand Canyon University. He also had been the head baseball coach at the university for twenty years, winning three national titles. The life and ministry of a priest are two aspects of the same journey, and beloved author and priest Barbara Cawthorne Crafton approaches this journey in four sections, envisioned as embracing a clerical life. The first, “The Dream,” contains the early years of discernment, training, and youthful ministry. The second, “Desert,” deals with the terrible obstacles (self-created or inflicted from outside), that may end a ministry or wound it deeply. The third, “The Dance,” is that period of time in which you know who you are and how you serve, and the flow of life and ministry is effectively graceful. The last, “The Death,” deals with the priest’s physical decline and death. Crafton lays out this path with all of her usual warmth and humor, offering insights and a companion in the way, not just to priests but to all of us.

BARBARA CAWTHORNE CRAFTON is a popular preacher, retreat leader, and writer. Her articles have appeared in the *New York Times*, *Reader’s Digest*, *Episcopal Life*, and other publications. 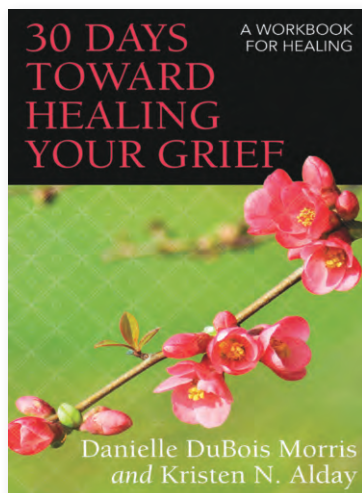

DANIELLE MORRIS, an Episcopal priest in the Diocese of Central Florida with extensive experience in loss and grief, created Walking the Mourners Path in 1996, and the eight-week grief support program is now used in nearly every state, Canada, Australia, and the Cayman Islands. A former television writer and producer, Morris, who earned a Bachelor of Arts in clinical psychology, has written and produced more than 120 mini medical documentaries for major networks, written for *Medical Tribune*, *Central Florida Magazine*, *Orlando Magazine*, *McCall's* magazine, among others, and has published seven children's books. She lives in Orlando, Florida.

KRISTEN N. ALDAY, Archdeacon, has a B.A. in economics from Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida, and worked in the private sector until becoming Chief Operating Officer for Walking the Mourner's Path. During her time there, she spent four years traveling the country, training clergy and laity in grief ministry. Ordained to the Diaconate, she serves as Archdeacon of the Episcopal Diocese of Central Florida. She earned a Master of Arts degree in counseling at Asbury Theological Seminary and spent two years as a licensed mental health intern in the State of Florida, specializing in issues surrounding grief and loss, anxiety and fear, and trauma that accompanies emotional, physical, or sexual abuse. She lives in Maitland, Florida.

Together, Morris and Alday trained facilitators in New York to help run grief groups a few weeks after 9/11 and served on a first response team from The Episcopal Church in New Orleans after hurricane Katrina. They travel around the country facilitating training groups and workshops.

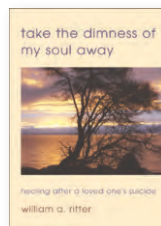

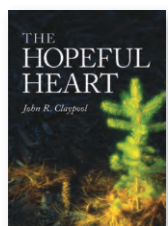

Few experiences are as wrenching as the loss of a child to suicide. Pastor William Ritter suffered such a loss, and his story is of a family struggling honestly with their pain that gradually provides comfort to others who grieve the same loss.

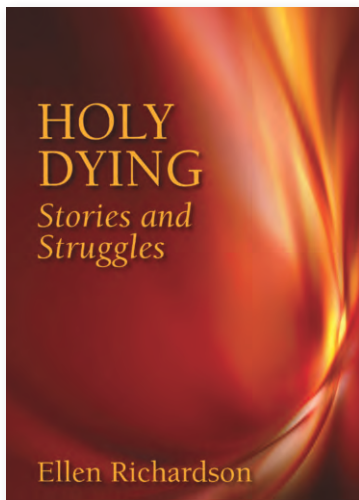

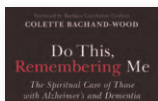

Human beings do not want to die; we spend infinite resources to sustain life, without regard to cost or quality. And yet we do die. Facing terminal illness and unprepared for death, we can feel abandoned by both secular and faith based institutions, whose focus on restoration can fall short of the wisdom and grace needed to embrace a holy death as a part of life.

Ellen Richardson hopes to change things by offering stories from her work in hospice and palliative care, and the rich resources of the church's Scripture and tradition, to create safe space for exploring questions we carry about dying. Her book is intended for individual readers, and to be used in group, workshop, or retreat settings within the church, so that practices of prayer and healing can become once more a source of comfort and strength, not simply tools of defiance against illness and weakness. No amount of faith will buy immortality for earthly bodies, but death need not be a time of failure and isolation. *Holy Dying* helps us lay claim to our scriptural stories as hard teachers of our mortal heritage.

ELLEN RICHARDSON, a physician who practiced Family Medicine for 14 years and worked for 10 years in hospice and palliative care, was ordained an Episcopal priest in 2008, and served bi-vocationally in congregations of varying sizes in Georgia and Virginia until her retirement from medicine. Since June 2014, she has served as a full time parish priest in the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia. She is a graduate of Episcopal Divinity School and lives in Tifton, Georgia.

CARTER HEYWARD graduated from Union Theological Seminary in New York City (Master of Arts degree, 1971; Master of Divinity degree, 1973; Doctorate degree, 1980), Danforth Scholar, 1978–80. She was among the first group of women ordained in Philadelphia in 1974. Heyward taught at Episcopal Divinity School, 1975–2005, and has been honored with distinguished Alumae Awards from Randolph Macon Woman’s College and Union Theological Seminary. She lives in Cedar Mountain, North Carolina. She is author or editor of thirteen books including *Keep Your Courage* and *The Spirit of The Lord is Upon Me*, Seabury Books.

Graceful Nurture

Using Godly Play with Adults
